



MISHAP REPORTING AND INVESTIGATION

CAP Regulation 66-2, dated 20 May 2014, is supplemented as follows:

SUMMARY OF CHANGES:

Change of reporting personnel

3.a. Added. CAWG Mishap Reporting. HQ CAWG must be notified at once in the event of any mishap involving CAWG personnel or equipment. Anyone having knowledge of such an event should immediately notify:

- a. The unit or activity commander, and
- b. The following individuals, IN THE ORDER LISTED, until one person is reached. That person will notify the remainder of the list.

3.b. Added. All mishaps meeting the criteria of First Aid Only/Matter of Record as defined in CAPR 62-2, shall be reported to Wing Headquarters immediately using the procedure stated in 3a above via email addresses. For all other mishaps not meeting criteria of First Aid Only/Matter of Record, notifications are to be made by telephone ONLY. Do not use the radio or other means, as it may seriously compromise subsequent activities. The above notice does not replace the notification by the unit or activity commander required under paragraph 4.a., "Accidents". The unit/activity commander must contact the CAP National Operations Center (NOC) toll free at 888.211.1812, Ext 300. In cases of serious injury or death, coordinate with the CAP General Counsel prior to completing the online Initial Mishap Notification. Otherwise, complete the online Initial Mishap Notification within 48 hours of the mishap.

3.c. Added. CAP-USAF notification. For mishaps involving serious injury, death or significant property damage, the first CAWG staff member listed above who is notified will ensure that the following CAP-USAF officers are notified:

**MISHAP REPORTING ACTIONS - CAPR 62-2
(in order)**



1. Ensure incident or injury is treated and controlled.
2. Gather initial facts concerning mishap (who, what, where, why, when and how).
3. Ensure contacts on opposite side of card are notified.
4. Ensure **BOTH** Step 1 and Step 2 info is inputted into the Safety Management System (SMS) **within 48 hrs.**
